



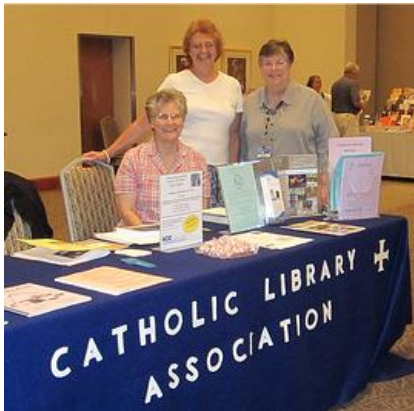

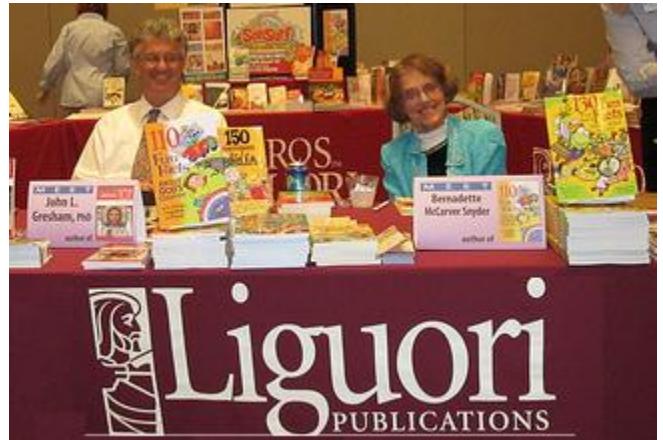
President's Message

Dear Friends,

ALA and AREI, along with OSB and LSP highlighted my summer days. I attended my first **American Libraries Association [ALA]** Conference June 24–29! I love Washington D.C., the mecca for librarians, and so filled my time with AASL and YALSA workshops, awards events, Newseum, exhibits (60 of those purveying ebooks), and Smithsonian sites. Authors were treated like rock stars, and I was lucky to meet many, including Printz winners Libba Bray (*Going Bovine*) and Deb Heiligmann (*Charles and Emma*). Natalie Merchant, an actual rock star, entertained us one evening with songs from *Leave Your Sleep*, her new double-CD that highlights a variety of musical arrangements of 19th and 20th century American and English poems. Children's Library Services Section Report —

Jo Ann Holdener:

Schools in the North County Deanery have formed a federation for collaboration on educational topics, issues, and activities. Teachers, principals, and specialists [librarians fit in here] will meet throughout the school year with colleagues of the same grade or specialty. These collaborative teams will meet independently at times and sometime as the whole federation, all groups included. The hope is that sharing ideas and cooperation on projects/programs, even some sharing of funds, will benefit all the schools who participate.

Academic / Archives Services Section Report—

Joanne Vogel:

Following successful discussions at the annual spring conference, the Academic and Archives section decided to meet again in the late spring. On June 1, a small but representative cross-section of librarians and archivists from the St. Louis area met in the cafe of the Borders bookstore on Brentwood Boulevard. The discussion continued what had been initiated in March, namely, the marketing of library services and the promotion of the work of librarians and archivists in a time of cost-cutting and, therefore, job-cutting. Joanne Vogel sent out several articles in advance to members of the section and these provided a basis for discussion. The group decided to meet again in the fall.

Parish / Community Services Section Report —

Craig George:

• **The parish section fall meeting will be Tuesday, October 19 at the Holocaust Museum.** Our meeting will begin at 9:30, followed by a tour and talk by a survivor. We can have up to 20 in the group and our parish section meetings usually have under 10, so other **CLA participants are welcome**, just let Craig George know.

• The survey of parish libraries (and librarians) in our archdiocese is underway. The first phase, starting in a few weeks, will be to glean information from e-mail and website responders.

All chapter members are invited to submit names and vitae of possible award recipients for the *Fons Sapientiae* Award. The committee [viz .Chris Turland, chair; Mary Jo Luszowski, Cherie LeMay, Martha Eise and Louise Powderly] selects two or three names from all the submissions which must be received before the Jan 23, 2011 board meeting. Board members vote. The award will be presented to the winner at Spring Conference at SLUH Mar 19, 2011.

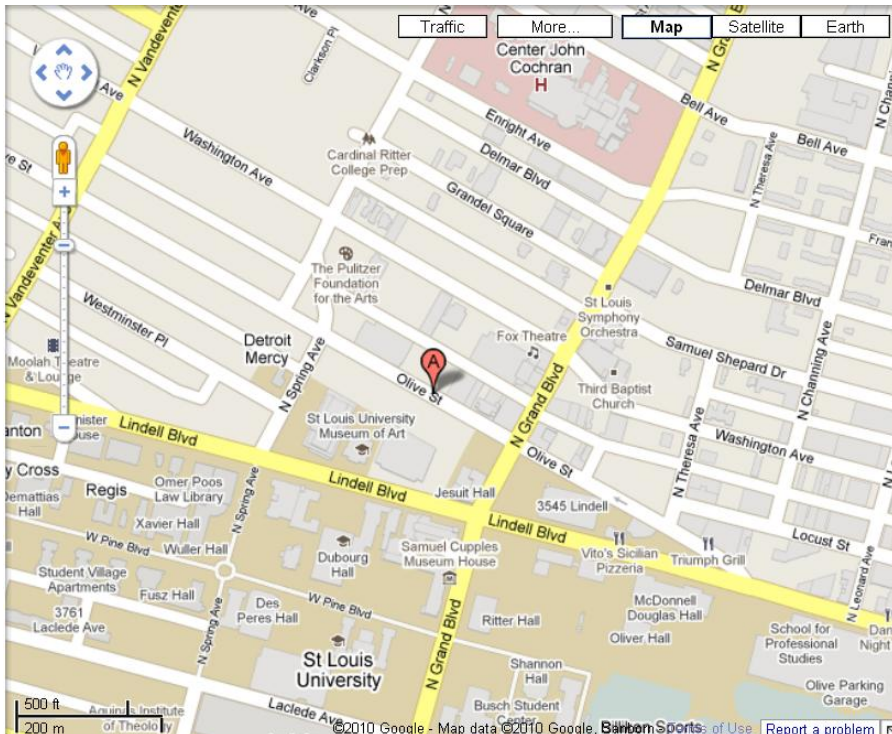

➤ There's a new book out by one of our own! Released this summer, *On God's Path: The Unfolding Story of Humanity* was written by local CLA member and Parish Section Chair **Craig George**. *On God's Path* presents a big-picture view of the history of humanity weaving together new insights from science and Bible scholarship. His book "is a realistic, pious, and optimistic view of humanity's role on the stage of creation. Starting from the first moment of creation, the author traces the rise of the human from both physical and ethical standpoints. The book examines the emergence of world religions weaving together lessons of science and theology in surprisingly clear and creative ways. With a Christian focus, human history and human motives are analyzed in the light of the teachings of Jesus. Fr Dominic's 8 Minute Pizza Sauce

1 15-oz can of crushed tomatoes, undrained
 1/4 cup tomato paste (about half a 6-oz can)
 1/4 cup red wine
 2 cloves of garlic, minced
 3 Tbs. grated Parmesan
 1 tsp. dried oregano
 1/4 tsp. dried basil
 1/4 tsp. black pepper
 Salt to taste

In a medium sauce pan, heat tomatoes, paste and wine over medium high heat for 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Stir in the seasonings, turn heat down, and simmer for 3 minutes. Remove from heat and cool to lukewarm before use. May be refrigerated for up to three days.

Notes

---I usually make huge batches of sauce for canning (see page XXX) but I realize that the average family doesn't need 8 quarts at a pop, so I developed this quick and easy pizza sauce with nicely balanced flavors. In a test taste by teens, this recipe won hands down.

---If you prefer a sweeter sauce, add a pinch of baking soda to take the edge off the acidity of the tomatoes and you probably won't need to add sugar.

---You'll get enough sauce for two or three pizzas, but if you have sauce left over, add another pinch of basil, a little sauteed celery and onion, and you'll have a decent pasta sauce for lunch the next day.
